A Review of 2017

Book of Mormon Central (BMC) accomplished much in 2017. We anticipate many more significant achievements this coming year. This newsletter will summarize 2017 successes and explain 2018 goals.

Interactive Scripture App

During the latter half of 2017, tremendous BMC resources began flowing to a new Interactive Book of Mormon App. More than thirty people several countries in are currently working on this project. Consultants are directing various technical aspects of the App.

For the first time, the Latter-day Saint scriptures will be available electronically, with abundant enrichment material hyperlinked to the scriptural text.

Material hyperlinked to the scriptural text will include: KnoWhy articles and videos; content from Book of Mormon Central's archive; artwork, textual variants; intertextual links between the Book of Mormon with other LDS scriptures; quotes from General Conference talks and BYU Devotionals; and insights from Book of Mormon commentaries.

At the end of 2017. Covenant Communications published а lavishlyillustrated book entitled Knowing Why – 137 Evidences that the Book of Mormon is *True.* This beautiful book, re-producing BMC's first 137 KnoWhys, is currently appealing to scholars and lay people alike. The book is available online and in LDS bookstores in both printed and narrated audio formats.

Publication of Weekly KnoWhys



In order to free-up resources to develop the Interactive Scriptures App, BMC during 2017 reduced new KnoWhy publication from five down to three and then two per week. KnoWhy #1 was published on January 1, 2016. KnoWhy #394 was published on December 28, 2017. During 2017, 25 KnoWhys published were directly supporting the Seminary Doctrinal Mastery curriculum and 11 more dealt with the Seminary Topical Essays. A number of 2017 KnoWhys clarified the large role the Book

of Mormon played in early LDS Church history.

2018, BMC During will publish many KnoWhys the exploring deep connections between the Book of Mormon and the Old Testament. Gospel Doctrine classes throughout the world will be studying the Old Testament this coming year, and these focused KnoWhys will undoubtedly be of interest to teachers and students alike.

Book of Mormon Reading Challenge

BMC challenged its users to read the Book of Mormon in the same amount of time it took Smith Joseph to translate it. With Oliver Cowderv as his scribe. Joseph Smith began translating the Book of Mormon on April 7th, 1829, and finished it by July 1st of that year - just 90 days! Hundreds took the challenge and enjoyed reading the Book of Mormon in the order and time-frame that Ioseph Smith translated it. BMC plans to repeat the Reading Challenge annually.



BMC Studios YouTube Channel



All KnoWhys have a short video posted on the BMC YouTube channel. We felt the need for a second channel dedicated to longer, made-for-YouTube videos.

BMC researchers and writers have been gathering and classifying evidences of the Book of Mormon, showing how science over time corroborates the Nephite text.

In 2017 BMC established <u>BMC</u> <u>Studios</u> to create a new brand identity for high-quality video content. The BMC Video Team produced 3 evidence videos last year and others are currently in the pipeline.

Viewers seeking up-to-date, well-researched evidences of the Book of Mormon can now find serious and satisfying productions at BMC Studios. These videos are definitely worth watching and sharing.

Book of Mormon Central User Engagements

BMC has seen a steady rise in user engagements since the inception of the organization. We define a "user engagement" as a view, read, listen, open, like, share, post, comment, tweet, pin, download, etc. of BMC content. In 2016, BMC had 5,540,000 user engagements. We are proud to announce that
BMC, with your help, exceeded our 2017 goal and tripled user engagements to 15,840,000. BMC has set another robust goal to triple user engagements again in 2018 to 45 million.

Questions and Answers

A "Questions & Answers" section will soon be going live on the BMC website. This feature will give concise answers to frequently asked questions about the Book of Mormon and then refer the

reader to further credible articles or research on the topic. These "Questions & Answers" will be released in batches to show that there have been, and continue to be, serious and scholarly answers to most queries regarding the Book of Mormon. We anticipate that this "Question & Answer" feature will soon become a subscriber favorite.

394 KnoWhys were published in English through the end of 2017. 273 of these were translated and <u>published in Spanish</u> during 2017. Over 60,000 people follow the <u>BMC Spanish Facebook page</u>. There is a hunger in the LDS Spanish-speaking community for high-quality Book of Mormon content.

On Saturday, November 18th, 2017, the first-ever serious Book of Mormon Conference was held in Mexico City. Avid students of the text came from hundreds of miles away to listen, learn, and share. A small cadre of Book of Mormon scholars is beginning to coalesce in Mexico around Book of Mormon Central en Español. Book of Mormon Central's Spanish Initiative

Book of Mormon Central Devotional Firesides

BMC board and staff members were invited to present devotionals and firesides in 2017 at LDS Institutes and similar gatherings along the Wasatch front; in St. George and Logan, Utah; and in Las Vegas, Nevada; Palo Alto, California; and Southington, Connecticut. In an effort to encourage engagement with the Book of Mormon, those attending the devotionals were introduced to the BMC website, KnoWhy App, and other BMC products. In addition, attendees enjoyed informative and inspiring messages about this

sacred work of scripture. These firesides were generally wellattended by young adults, college students and their families who are our principal target audience. Several LDS institute directors have asked BMC staff to return for future engagements.

Chiasmus Conference and Jubilee

August 16, 2017 marked the 50th anniversary of John W. Welch's discovery of chiasmus in the Book of Mormon. Many consider this ancient literary style of reverse parallelism to be strong evidence that the Book of Mormon is an ancient Hebrew text – just as its authors and the prophet Joseph Smith claim it to be.

To celebrate this event, a twoday scholarly conference was held in the Joseph Smith Building auditorium on the Brigham Young University campus. The two-day celebration ended with an evening Jubilee, looking back at the past 50 years of chiasmus scholarship and looking ahead to the next 50 years. The Joseph Smith Building Auditorium was filled to capacity, requiring ushers to direct some of the crowd to overflow pre-arranged seating.

Welch meeting with Jesuit Priest Paul Gaechter to discuss chiasmus in the Book of Mormon; and (4) the presentation of the festschrift volume entitled "To Seek the Law of the Lord: Essays in Honor of John W. Welch."
